Phonics

Phonics is taught at Cedars Manor following the Little Wandle Programme. Children in Reception are taught Phonics daily between 9am and 9:30am.

Reading

This year we will be using Learning With Parents to record reading at school and at home. You will receive information shortly on how to activate your Learning with Parents Account. There will also be a workshop to demonstrate how to use the platform.

Reading expectations: Please read with your child daily to develop confidence and fluency in reading.

Reading days at school: The children will read at school with an adult 3 times a week. They will bring this book home with them on Fridays.

Children need to wear a plain t-shirt of their school house colour and black shorts and black pumps.

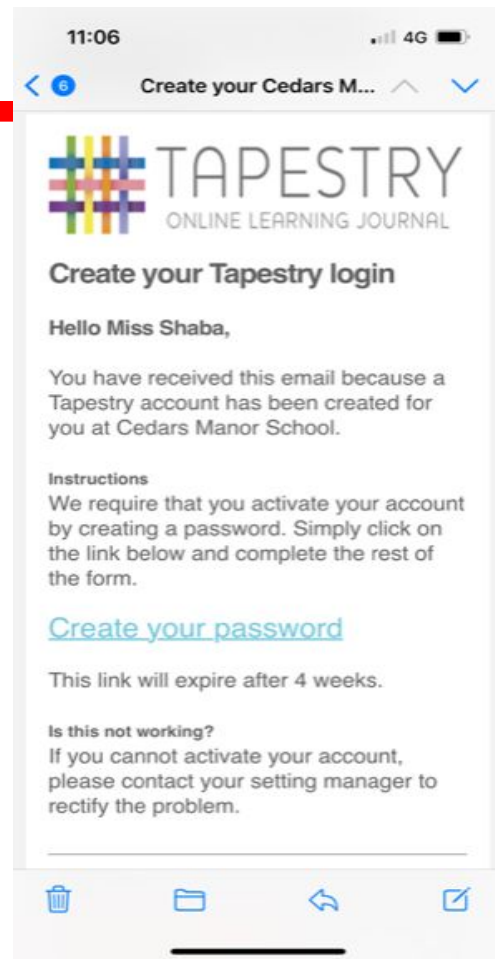
Children need to have their PE kit and pumps in a string drawn bag on their pegs. These stay in the class all the time.

It is important that we have your current phone number on record.

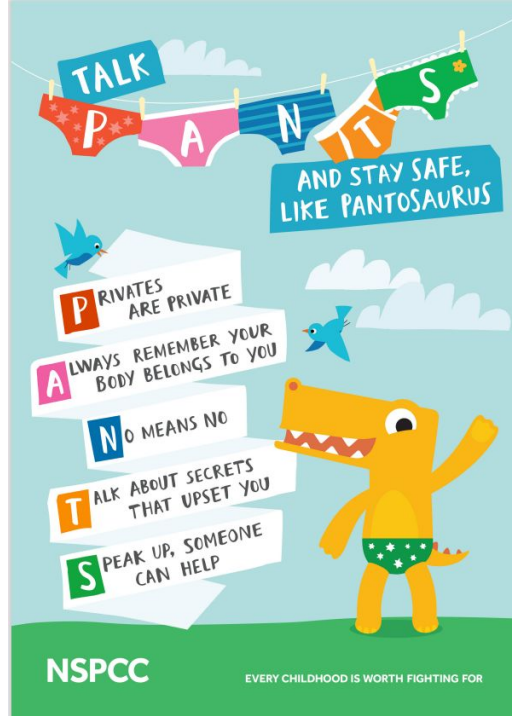
Please remember to let us know if there are any changes.

- Remind children **NOT** to give personal information to anyone they are chatting to online when playing games.
- Remind children **NEVER** to agree to meet anyone they have been talking to online.

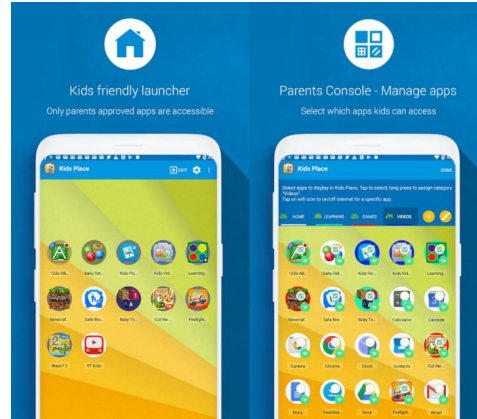
YouTube and TikTok are particularly popular with primary aged children; however, there are things to think about:

- Children can be exposed to adult content or unsuitable videos if they click on related videos
- Uploading videos of themselves (although innocently done) could make them vulnerable to online *trolling* or *predators*

It is advisable that you set YouTube search to **‘safe mode’**. You can find out how in the

- *Turn the Wifi off at bedtime*



Have a conversation with your child!

Children may be very worried that your response to a problem will be to take away their internet access. Whilst this may be an appropriate response in some cases, the threat may be a barrier for a child who needs help. Be aware of this when talking to them about their internet use, and reassure them that they can talk to you or a trusted adult whenever there is a problem.
