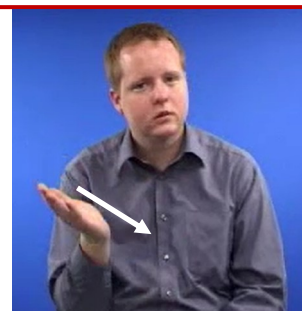

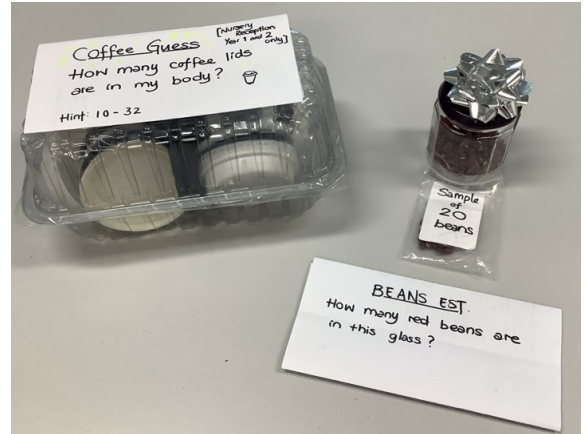
YEAR 5 MUSIC PERFORMANCE

LEARNING AT CEDARS MANOR SCHOOL

Nursery

We have been learning: about the books Oliver's Vegetables and Oliver's Fruit Salad and made our own tasty fruit salad.

You can help at home by: exploring new fruit and vegetables from the shops and discuss if they grow on trees or in the ground.

Reception

We have been learning: number bonds to 10. Two numbers that equals 10.

You can help at home by: using 10 coins to split into two groups, to find two numbers that equals 10.

Year 1

We have been learning: about Beegu and exploring themes of friendship and helping others who are lost.

You can help at home by: encouraging your child to talk about how they can be kind, make friends, and support people in need.

Year 2

We have been learning: about volume and capacity

You can help at home by: using everyday containers to pour and compare litres and millilitres through play. Remind them that 1000 millilitre (ml) equals 1 litre (l).

Year 3

We have been learning: how to sew a simple running stitch

You can help at home by: talking with your child about how garments are made and, if possible, help them continue practicing a simple running stitch at home.

Year 4

We have been learning: All about Living things and their environments.

You can help at home by: asking about our Science field trip to Headstone Manor park and all the wonderful local birds we saw in their natural habitats.

Year 5

We have been learning: about the characteristics and effects of earthquakes in Geography.

You can help at home by: sharing with the children personal experiences or they can watch documentaries about earthquakes.

Year 6

We have been learning: about alternative endings to a story

You can help at home by: asking them to read any book and create their own ending.
